In response to concerns raised over the transfer of money from the group accounts to the shop accounts we have found that this exercise i.e. the physical transfer of the cash is no longer necessary in accounting for the split of care/ shop expenditure.

While this task has been carried out over the past 10 + years i.e. head office recharging groups for shop/care expenditure (well before the central shops account), this will no longer be necessary as we are able to apportion the costs via our accounting software.

I will continue to update groups on the profitability of their local shops and, as always, if any of you have any questions regarding shops finance I am happy to assist.

The Prolife Research Unit & the Cross-Party Prolife Parliamentary Group

A vital part of our work and one of LIFE's best-kept secrets is our involvement as founder members of the Prolife Research Unit. This unit supports the Cross-Party Prolife Parliamentary Group through the provision of information, articles, speeches and briefing papers for Members of Parliament. It is also this group that is behind the initiative to raise awareness of prolife issues such as abortion and assisted suicide that you will hear about through the press and church and community groups. Various campaigns are organised ranging from lobbying MPs, post cards and email campaigns and events in Parliament.

LIFE continues to take a lead in this group by providing a member of staff for a few days each week. Stephen attended his first meeting reiterating LIFE's commitment to the initiative. The Research Unit is supported by Care, Right to Life, and LIFE. Stephen said: "The research unit and Prolife Parliamentary Group are the primary way of influencing Parliament...if an organisation is not round this table, then they limit their impact on the laws of this country."
